About the Organization

Edible Schoolyard NYC's (ESYNYC) mission is to support edible education for every child in New York City. We partner with New York City public schools to cultivate healthy students and communities through hands-on cooking and gardening education, transforming children's relationship with food. Inspired by the philosophy and model of Edible Schoolyard Berkeley and its founder, acclaimed restaurateur and food activist Alice Waters, Edible Schoolyard NYC was founded in 2010 to serve the specific needs of students in historically underserved public schools. We are guided by six core values: 1. Passion and dedication 2. Community 3. Learning and discovery 4. Wellness 5. Collaboration 6. Equity.

Overview

Edible Schoolyard NYC is looking for a masters of public health, nutrition, or education student to serve as a part-time evaluation fieldwork intern to analyze and draft reports on three online survey data sets.

Responsibilities

- Clean and prepare for analysis data from three online Survey Gizmo surveys:
 - School Staff Survey
 - Professional Development Participant Post Workshop Survey
 - Professional Development Participant Follow Up Survey
- Use Survey Gizmo, Excel, and Google Sheets to analyze data from the 3 surveys
- Draft a report on the Staff Survey and the Professional Development Surveys including:
 - Graphs/visualizations
 - Descriptive statistics
 - Themes
 - Trends over time
 - Recommendations

The Fieldwork Intern reports to the Evaluation Manager, who acts as internship preceptor. The Evaluation Manager will provide the logistical and instructive support necessary to carry out the activities described above and develop the Fieldwork Intern's skills.



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Qualifications

This is the right internship for you if you:

- Have strong spreadsheet skills: you can easily write and edit formulas, copy, sort, filter, make graphs, and pivot tables on Google sheets and Excel.
- You have completed or are currently enrolled in graduate level statistics, research/evaluation classes
- Are ready to problem solve with little supervision
- Are known for your excellent attention to detail

The following qualification are helpful but are not required:

- You are passionate about food justice and know your stuff when it comes to gardens and cooking education, nutrition, or public health
- You know your way around SPSS data analysis software
- You can make custom charts and graphs beyond automatic generated ones

Compensation and Hours

- This is an unpaid position for fieldwork credit.
- Fieldwork interns are invited to participate in one of our summer Professional Development workshop offerings.
- This internship generally runs from July 1 to August 30th, 15-20 hours/week, and can be somewhat flexible to accommodate fieldwork requirements and vacation.
- Work can take place remotely (using a password protected internet connection) or in the ESYNYC DUMBO office
- Hours are flexible and will be scheduled with the Evaluation Manager
